Our week starts off with a bang, as Luke confirms Matthew's and Mark's accounts of Jesus' glorious mountaintop transfiguration. As the book of Deuteronomy draws to a close, so does the life of Moses. Knowing this, the great leader prepares the Israelites to continue without him. He reminds them one last time of their covenant with God, and he names a steadfast military man as his successor who will lead them to their long-awaited conquest and settlement of the Promised Land.

Luke gives his account of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, including one event that is found nowhere else in the Gospels: Jesus' stirring words to the criminal crucified beside him. In the Old Testament, God's people fall into a cycle of sinfulness and oppression by their pagan neighbors, but God is never far from them. When they cry out for help, he appoints certain individuals to rescue them—"judges" such as Deborah and Gideon.
