In the New Testament, Paul closes his letter to the Romans with an appeal to his fellow believers to strive for unity, truth, and kindness in everything they do. In the Old Testament, the growing menace of the Assyrians and the Babylonians doesn't stop kings like Hezekiah and Josiah from trying to lead the kingdom of Judah back to God. But it will get worse before it gets better.
