In the New Testament, Jesus heals sick people on the Sabbath and teaches that he is the only way to salvation, but these radical statements soon draw the resentment of powerful Jewish leaders. The Old Testament sets the scene for the birth of the Israelite kingdom, introducing us to the prophet Samuel and to the first king of Israel, Saul. Samuel warns the people of the future consequences of having a king, but they refuse to listen.
