

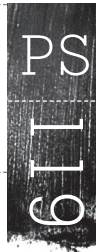
THIS WEEK IN THE BIBLE

Jeremiah then takes the prophetic stage, describing the coming judgment for Israel's southern kingdom and earning himself the nickname "the weeping prophet." 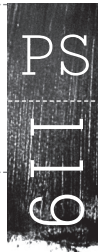
THIS WEEK IN THE BIBLE

THIS WEEK IN THE BIBLE

Jeremiah recounts his conflict with a false prophet who is offering false assurances to the rebellious people of Judah. Saddened, Jeremiah knows that only exile will compel the Israelites to reconsider their choices, turn back to God, and be blessed. In the New Testament, Paul mentors a young leader named Timothy, helping him navigate the challenges of church leadership and encouraging him to let his faith—not his age—define him.

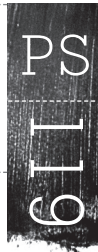
THIS WEEK IN THE BIBLE
